Response to Benny from Louise Crandell-Rabbitt Hi Benny, I'm responding to the letter that you wrote to Gene. It's with great sadness that I tell you that Gene passed away in August of 2002 after undergoing a procedure at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York.

To give you a little history of what happened in Gene's life after FSU; he joined Continental Can Corporation where he held several positions in Arbitration and eventually headed up Continental's Fiber Drum Division in Stamford Connecticut.
